Mr. David Daniel was a long time parishioner and supporter of St. Patrick Catholic School. He left a legacy of **honor, integrity, and service** when he went home to the Father. This scholarship, established in 2018 in his honor, gives a helping hand to the next generation of St. Patrick School children. Three \$500 tuition scholarships are awarded every to current students so that they can continue their education at the school Mr. Daniel loved and supported. Students must be enrolled for the 2023-2024 school year. The recipients should demonstrate the virtues of **honor, integrity, and service** to the St. Patrick community.

Every current student fully enrolled for the 2022-2023 school year may apply for this scholarship. Each student should submit their answer in a separate document. Please save your answer as a Word document or PDF named:

For students in PreK-1st grade: Parents should help the child to write (or the parent may write down their words) to the answer to these questions:

“How does my family help to make St. Patrick School a better place? How do I love Jesus at school? How do I help my friends at school? What will I do next year to be the best student I can be?”

For students in grades 2-7: Students should write or type their answer to this question:

“How does my family help to make St. Patrick School a better place? How do I contribute to my school in faith, academics, service and community?”

There is no length requirement.



Nicole Moore Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 2020 with the donations given in memory of Nicole Moore, class of 2008. One \$500 tuition scholarship will be given each year to current St. Patrick School students for the following school year.

Nicole is a beautiful example to all St. Patrick students, because even in the midst of sufferings and difficulties, she grew in her faith. She did not let her sufferings get her down, but they made her stronger. The recipients will be chosen based on their answer to the essay question, but even more importantly, their demonstration of the virtues of **faith, kindness and joy**.

Every current student fully enrolled for the 2023-2024 school year may apply for this scholarship. Each student should submit their answer on a separate document. Please save your answer as a Word document or PDF named: **NMScholarshipStudentName** (insert student name there) and email to svm@sps-tn.org by Friday, April 21. Recipients will be announced at the Awards Ceremony after the morning Mass on Friday, May 19.

For students in PreK-1st grade: Parents should help the child to write (or the parent may write down their words) at least 3 sentences to these questions:

**“How do I help my family to grow in our faith together, especially in difficult times?
How does attending St. Patrick School help me and my family to grow in our faith?
How does my family help other families in our school community in times of
difficulty?” Give examples.**

For students in grades 2-7: Students should type their answer of *at least* one complete paragraph to this question:

“How do I protect my faith? How do I use difficult circumstances as opportunities for my faith to grow stronger and to help others do the same?” Give examples.
